# Laem Chabang AYUTTHAYA: THE ANCIENT CAPITAL OF SIAM

#### Description

An excursion to learn about the fascinating history of the ancient kingdom of Siam through the amazing ruins and temples of its capital.

#### What we will see

- Ayutthaya Historical Park: ruins of the old city
- Bang Pa-In Royal Palace or Summer Palace
- Wat Mahathat
- Wat Phra Sri Sanphet
- Wihan Phra Mongkon Bophit and statue of the seated Buddha
- Wat Yai Chai Mongkon
- Buffet lunch

#### What we will do

- Our thrilling journey back in time starts with the fascinating ruins of the old city forming the so-called Ayutthaya Historical Park and declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991. While exploring the area, we make out its original urban layout made up of moats, palaces and majestic temples decorated with rows of enigmatic stone Buddha statues.
- The wealth of pagodas and dwellings and the large number of navigable canals led to it being known as Venice of the East.
- We then visit the enchanting and important complex of the Bang Pa-In Royal Palace, also known as the Summer Palace, which was built in 1632. The current buildings are the result of a restoration commissioned between 1872 and 1889 by King Chulalongkorn and are eclectic examples of Thai, European and Chinese architecture.
- The palace is made up of five imposing buildings: a lovely Thai-style pavilion right in the middle of an artificial lake, a twostorey pavilion of European influence for official ceremonies, a pavilion which was once used as residence during the high tide season, a Chinese-style pavilion where the court used to live during the cool rainy season and an observatory located on an islet offering breath-taking views of the surrounding countryside.
- After a thrilling elephant ride (2 people per animal), we visit the **Wat Phra Sri Sanphet**, the most important temple in the ancient complex of the Grand Royal Palace made up of three large stupas dating back to the family of King Rama Thibodi II and his father, who both lived here in the 15th century, and which had the same function as Bangkok's Emerald Buddha Temple.
- Our excursion continues with the **Wihan Phra Mongkhon Bophit**, where one of the largest **seated Buddha** statues in the world is located together will smaller statues found in the same area.
- The vihara (hall) was destroyed in 1767 when the Burmese ransacked Ayutthaya and was rebuilt in the original style in 1956.
- Finally, we visit the **Wat Yai Chai Mongkon**, a majestic meditation pagoda built in 1357 by King U Thong and whose remains can be seen from afar.



- We end our historical excursion with a **buffet lunch** of Thai specialities in a local restaurant before heading back to the port.
- There is limited availability of English-language guides.



- Our excursion starts with the majestic Maha Jessada Bodin pavilion, an idea spot to take a few pictures of the old city.
- We overlook the entire area below with a panoramic view of the **Golden Mount temple**, the highest in Bangkok, the historic **fort** with the ancient **city walls** and the **Wat Ratchanatdaram**, a Buddhist temple with a pink pyramid named *Loha Pradat* (pagoda with a metal tip), 36 metres tall and the only one in the world.
- Our sightseeing coach tour continues with the **Constitution Monument**, **Sunday Plaza**, the **City Pillar Shrine**, the **Grand Palace**, the **Emerald Buddha Temple**, the **Ministry of Defence**, the **Temple of the Reclining Buddha** and **Wat Suthat**, where we can admire the enormous bronze Buddha dating back to the Sukhothai period (15th century) as well as the frescoes in the Ordination Hall.
- Right in front of Wat Suthat, we can admire the **Giant Swing**. In the past, these two teak columns were used during a Brahmanic festivity: before the ban in 1932, young Hindu monks used to swing and rotate 180° trying to catch a satchel filled with gold coins with their teeth. Even if a few managed to catch it, many died during this dangerous activity.
- After our tour, we enjoy an international **buffet lunch** at a local restaurant, after which we stop to take photos at the fabulous **Marble Temple** (Wat Benchamabophit), built in precious Carrara marble.
- Finally, before returning to the ship, we have some free time to do some shopping.

### **CU CHI TUNNELS AND PANORAMIC HO CHI MINH**

#### Description

You will leave the port aboard a coach for Cu Chi district through bustling Ho Chi Minh City, with its elegant colonial architecture and shady-tree lined avenues, and along busy streets thronged with people and vehicles of all kinds. On your way you will have an opportunity to view the beautiful country landscapes with vast, peaceful rice paddies tilled by industrious peasants and their water buffaloes. Following arrival at Cu Chi Park you will see the charts and maps detailing the tunnel system. Your guide will then escort you to the section of the tunnel that once housed the headquarters of the area commander. You will be amazed to discover the size and depth of the tunnels, with their kitchens, living quarters, bunkers, field hospitals, etc., which were specially designed and constructed to protect the Viet Cong guerrillas. You will also be invited to experience a tunnel passage that has been enlarged to accommodate the larger frames of Western tourists. Lunh with typical Vietnamese food will be served at local restaurant. After leaving Cu Chi Tunnels, you will proceed to Ho Chi Minh City. Your exploration will continue with a panoramic city tour affording outside views of the Reunification Palace, the neo-Romanesque Notre Dame Cathedral, the colonial-style Central Post Office and Opera House before returning to the ship.

# PHU MY (VIETNAM) HISTORICAL HO CHI MINH

It is now the most popular museum in Ho Chi Minh City with Western tourists and illustrates many of the atrocities documented during the Vietnam War. Your next stop will be the Reunification Palace, formerly known as the Independence Palace, where on 30 April 1975 a North Vietnamese tank crashed through the front gate, symbolically liberating the country. It was rebuilt and completed in 1966 on the site of the Norodom Palace that was bombed in 1962. You will then enjoy a panoramic city tour with outside views of the neo-Romanesque Notre Dame Cathedral, the colonial-style Central Post Office and Opera House, where your driver will stop to allow you take photographs. Then lunch with Vietnamese cuisine will be served at local restaurant. Your tour will continue with a panoramic drive in Chinatown, west of the business district. It was built from 1788 by the city's Chinese and Vietnamese inhabitants and was previously called Cho Lon (Big Market). Here you will visit the famous Thien Hau Pagoda, dating back to the eighteenth century and dedicated to Lady Thien Hau, the Chinese Goddess of the Sea. The pagoda houses beautiful ceramic figurines and a scale model of a boat, commemorating the arrival of the first Chinese from Canton. Finally you will have some free time for shopping in the downtown malls and Ben Thanh Market before returning to the ship. This is the most crowded and interesting area of Ho Chi Minh City, which caters to both the daily needs of the local people – with products such as fruit, sweets, tobacco, clothing, hats and household goods – and tourists, with souvenirs including handicrafts, wooden items and T-shirts.

# PHU MY (VIETNAM) A day discovering ho chi minh

#### Description

You will leave the port by coach to Ho Chi Minh City for visit of the Museum of National History, situated at the entrance to the Botanical and Zoological Gardens. The museum was built in 1929 and houses many artifacts chronicling Vietnam's 4,000-year history. You will be able to admire its ancient ceramics, traditional costumes, and stone and bronze relics. Here you'll also enjoy a show with many interesting acts. Your next stop will be the Reunification Palace(outside visit), formerly known as the Independence Palace, where on 30 April 1975 a North Vietnamese tank crashed through the front gate, symbolically liberating the country. It was rebuilt and completed in 1966 on the site of the Norodom Palace that was bombed in 1962. You will then enjoy a panoramic city tour with outside views of the neo-Romanesque Notre Dame Cathedral, the colonial-style Central Post Office and City Square, where your driver will stop to allow you take photographs. Next you will continue to a local restaurant, where you will enjoy a lunch of delicious Vietnamese dishes. After lunch, you will visit a lacquer workshop, where you will watch the skilled craftsmen at work before having the chance to take a look at the many items for sale. Then, you will visit Chinatown, west of the business district. It built from 1788 by the city's Chinese and Vietnamese inhabitants and was previously called Cho Lon (Big Market). Here you will visit the famous Thien Hau Pagoda, dating back to the eighteenth century and dedicated to Lady Thien Hau, the Chinese Goddess of the Sea. The pagoda houses beautiful ceramic figurines and a scale model of a boat, commemorating the arrival of the first Chinese from Canton. Finally you will have some free time for shopping at B?n Thanh Market before returning to the ship. This is the most crowded and interesting area of Ho Chi Minh City, which caters to both the daily needs of the local people - with products such as fruit, sweets, tobacco, clothing, hats and household goods - and tourists, with souvenirs including handicrafts, wooden items and Tshirts.

After our visit, we will watch a short and lovely local folklore show.

• We will then visit the **Independence Palace** from outside, reconstructed and completed in 1966 at the place where the Norodom Palace stood and which was bombarded in 1962. On 30 April 1975, a North Vietnamese armed tank burst through the main entrance, symbolising liberation of the country.



- The next stage is the **lacquer production laboratory**, where we will see expert craftspersons working and we will have the possibility to purchase the objects being sold.
- We will finish up the morning with lunch in a local restaurant, where we can taste the delights of Vietnamese cuisine.
- After lunch, our tour continues with a visit to the quarter of Chinatown, to the west of the city centre. In this ancient quarter, once called Cho Lon (Large Market) which was built by the Vietnamese and Chinese in 1788, we will visit the famous Chinese Pagoda or Thien Hau Pagoda, dedicated to Thien Hau, the Chinese Sea Goddess. The pagoda, built in the 18th Century, houses a marvellous collection of ceramic statuettes and a scale model of a vessel used by the first Chinese people originating from Canton. At the end of the tour, we will have some free time for shopping in the centre's shops and in the Ben Thanh Market\*\*, where we can find the most varied of items such as clothing, hats, foodstuffs and homeware, as well as evidently, many locally produced souvenirs.

"Hoi An one of the city have three major rivers that is Thu Bon river, Truong Giang river and e Vong river and with a mangrove forest of coconut water is a wonderful destination.

The mangrove coco forests Bay Mau located 5 km to the East of Hoi An city (2 and 3 village, Cam Thanh commune) is surrounded by water. It was a revolutionary base in the resistance and is one of the core zone of biosphere reserves world Hoi An – Cham Island. Bay Mau coconut forest is not only a monument has special historical value, it is also a unique ecological area with water flooded forests c-harming landscapes. Nowaday it have been narrowed to only 58ha of forest, but coconut is still a rare feature in wetland. In here, with seagrass ecosystems. This is also a place of many marine species of value, especially shrimp, crab and molluscs. Last year, UNESCO has recognized Hoi An– Cham Island is a biosphere reserve in the world. Including this area.

Your next stop will be the Assembly Hall of the Fujian Chinese Congregation, founded in 1697 by the Fujian Chinese merchants of Hoi An as a venue for community meetings. This temple is

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architecturally unique and boasts artistic decorations and beautiful statues. Your tour will continue with a visit to the Japanese Covered Bridge, built in 1593 by the Japanese Community of Hoi An to link their neighborhood to the Chinese quarter across the river. # Da-Nang DEEP VIETNAM, HOI AN, MARBLE MOUNTAIN & SHOPPING

#### Description

You will leave the port aboard a coach for an hour and a half drive along Provincial Route 603 to Marble Mountain where you can have a chance of overview Da Nang city from the top of mountain. Here, Non Nuoc Stone-Carving Village at the foot of the Marble Mountain, where you can find firsthand skilled carvers chisel out a great variety of fine marble products of all sizes and designs. Next will be the exploration of Hoi An, an ancient town of Quang Nam Province, is located on the banks of Thu Bon river. Strolling around the town through its narrow streets, you will find a fascinating blend of European, Chinese, Vietnamese and Japanese temples, community houses, shrines, clan houses, shop houses and homes. Upon arrival in Hoi An, you will visit the Hoi An Museum of History and Culture. The museum was constructed at a place where once was a temple of "Quan Cong". In here, you will see many exhibits on the foundation, development and depression of Hoi An Ancient Town. Your next stop is the Assembly Hall of the Fujian Chinese Congregation. The assembly was founded in 1697 by Fujian Chinese merchants of Hoi An as a place to hold community meetings. Later on, it was transformed into a temple for the worship of Thien Hau, the Goddess of the sea and Protector of Fishermen and Sailors. This temple is architecturally unique with its artistic ornament and beautiful statues. Now you are heading to a workshop. In here, you will explorer different traditional handicrafts such as wood sculture, mat weaving, embroidery, silkworm breeding, silkworm unravelling etc...Your tour program will continue with a visit of the Japanese Covered Bridge Pagoda. The pagoda was built in 1593 by the Japanese Community of Hoi An to link their neighbourhood with the Chinese Quarters. The bridge was provided with the roof so it could be used as a shelter from both the rain and the sun. On the Northern side of the bridge is a Japanese Pagoda to protect sailors.. Leaving the bridge pagoda, you are now proceeding to one of the old houses in Hoi An town. The old house was constructed almost two centuries ago as the house of a Vietnamese merchant. The design of the house shows how local architecture followed Japanese and Chinese influences. Your last stop is in Hoi An market. Located on Thu Bon river's bank, the market is considered one of the most convoluted sites of Hoi An Ancient Town. Unlike any market places in the world, Hoi An Market includes different types of commodity such as fish, vegetables, meat, fruits, handicrafts, cloths, jewelry etc... Last before returning the ship, you will have lunch in a typical Vietnamese restaurant. Finally, your coach will follow the same route back to Da Nang City, where you will enjoy a 30minute sightseeing tour. Da Nang is located on the west bank of Han river. Formerly known as Tourane under French rule, it had

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grown from a small fishing village into an important port in central Vietnam. It was also the landing point of the Americans during the Vietnam Wars. Today, Da Nang is the fourth largest city in Vietnam offering many fascinating cultural and historical places of interest. Reboard your coach, you will return the port for re-embarkation.

Please Note: Space is limited, so please reserve early. The order of the itinerary may vary. Please wear comfortable walking shoes and casual clothing. To reach the top of Marble Mountain you will climb about 150 steps. This is a walking tour, not recommended for people with mobility problems. Don't forget to bring mosquitoes repellent

#### Description


You will leave the port aboard a coach for a two-hour drive along the scenic National Route 1. Upon arrival in Hue, you will visit King Tu Duc's Mausoleum, one of the most majestic of the royal tombs. Located in a narrow valley in Duong Xuan Thuong Village, 8km from Hue City, Tu Duc Tomb is considered as one of the most beautiful and picturesque and largest works of architecture of Nguyen Dynasty's royal palaces and tombs. People say that Tu Duc Tomb is a must in every tour to Hue City. The tomb was constructed between 1864 and 1867. The construction of Tu Duc's tomb requires an incredible amount of money and labour, thus resulted in a rebellion of workers. Therefore, the tomb was renamed as Khiem Lang, in comparison with the former name: Van Nien Co (expresses the wish to be permanent). In addition, all the constructions' names were changed to bear the word Khiem (Modesty) in their names, as the king wanted to express his humility.. After visiting the mausoleum you'll stop at Thien Mu (Heavenly Lady) Pagoda for an inside visit. The pagoda was built during the seventeenth century, on Ha Khe Hill on the left bank of the Perfume River, and was rebuilt several times. It now covers an area of 4 hectares and features several noteworthy works and valuable objects: Phuoc Duyen Tower with seven tiers, each of which was dedicated to the worship of one of the reincarnations of Buddha; the Dai Hong Chung Bell, which was cast during the eighteenth century and weighs 2,052 kilogrammes; and a marble stele 2.3 metres high and 1.2 metres wide, which was carved in 1715 and is mounted on a marble tortoise. Boarding the local boat and cruise on Perfume River towards to the restaurant. Perfume River (Huong River), Hue derives from Truong Son Mountain. The two springs namely Ta Trach (Left Tributary) and Huu Trach (Right Tributary) meet at the junction of Bang Lang fork and create the Perfume River. Perfume River is truly a priceless godsend to Hue City. The Perfume River Cruise is 30km long and that is from Bang Lang to Thuan An estuary. In this region the stream runs very slowly. Beautifully as well as mysteriously the color of the Perfume River becomes darker when it runs along the foot of Ngoc Tran Mount - the Jade Cup Temple. Upon arrival of local restaurant, you will enjoy an Imperial Court-style lunch with delicious Vietnamese specialties. Your tour will then continue with a visit to the Imperial Citadel,





whose design was based on that of Beijing's Forbidden City. It is made up of three separate walled enclosures: the Exterior Enclosure, the Imperial Enclosure and the Forbidden Purple City. Unfortunately, the Royal Citadel sustained heavy damage during the war and many of its majestic buildings were destroyed. However, since being recognized as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site, considerable restoration has been carried out to recover its overall magnificence, and you will find it a fascinating place to explore. The Five Phoenix Watch Tower, where the king used to sit during grand royal rituals, is especially interesting. Please Note: The order of the itinerary may vary. Space is limited, so please reserve early. This tour is not recommended for guests with mobility problems. Please wear comfortable walking shoes and casual clothing. The coach ride between Da Nang and Hue takes about 3 hours. Don't forget to bring mosquitoes repellent.

After visiting a Buddhist monastery, we will be in the right frame of mind to enjoy the smells, colours and all the curiosities of three of the most interesting markets in the small city-state, to discover the local traditions and rituals.

- Jade Market
- Wet Market

#### What we will do

- Stepping ashore we are welcomed by a comfortable coach that takes us to **Chi Lin Nunnery**, a Buddhist monastic complex, opened as a museum, which includes not only the monastery, but also temple rooms dedicated to the Buddha, Chinese gardens and even a vegetarian restaurant and hostel to accommodate visitors.
- Countless statues in gold, stone, clay and wood are on display in the temple halls. The entire construction is based on





traditional Chinese architecture dating from the Tang Dynasty that uses special interlocking systems and not nails to fasten the wooden beams.

- Changing scene, our next stop is the colourful **Flower Market** in the heart of Hong Kong. A small oasis of scents in the midst of dense high-rise buildings of the city, where as well as plants and flowers we find a wide range of useful accessories such as baskets, plant stands, and dried flower arrangements.
- Here we come upon the famous **Good Luck Plants** such as the *Lucky Bamboo* and other original flower arrangements that are so much part of ancient Chinese tradition.
- We continue our tour visiting another famous market, the **Jade Market**. In Hong Kong, jade is considered a symbol of wealth. The various and artistic accessories made with this stone are worn both for celebrations and in ceremonies to ward off evil spirits.
- The market offers different qualities of this valuable stone, in its various colours and in different shapes, each of which has a different meaning, as deer (wealth), tiger (good luck), dragon (power).
- We can hardly return to the ship without having popped into one final market among the many in this bustling and extraordinary city. In the **wet market**, a lively place frequented daily by locals and tourists, we can find items of all kinds.


In this tour, you will visit destinations that you can learn about past and present of Tokyo The Tokyo National Museum is one of the oldest and largest of Japan's top-level national museums. It was originally established in 1972 at Yushima Seido Shrine and moved to its current location in Ueno Park a few years later. The Tokyo National Museum features one of the largest and best collections of art and archeological artifacts in Japan, made up of over 110,000 individual items including nearly a hundred national treasures. The Kaminarimon ("Thunder Gate") is the outer of two large entrance gates that ultimately leads to the Senso-ji in Asakusa, Tokyo. The gate, with its lantern and statues, is popular with tourists. The length of the street is approximately 250 meters and contains around 89shops. Tokyo Tower is a communications and observation tower located in the Shiba-koen district of Minato, Tokyo, Japan. At 333 metres (1,093 ft), it is the second-tallest structure in Japan. The structure is an Eiffel Tower-inspired lattice tower that is painted white and international orange to comply with air safety regulations. You will enjoy Japanese style lunch during this tour.
